PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed "Apex River Drinking Water Supply" project is located within the Qikiqtani region, within the municipal boundaries of Iqaluit. The Proponent intends to conduct water transfer via pumping from the Apex River to the Lake Geraldine Reservoir to meet the City of Iqaluit's water requirements. The program is proposed to take place from July 2019 to July 2026. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Withdrawal of up to 500,000 cubic metres (m³) of water annually from the Niaquanguk (Apex) River and surrounding watershed to supplement the Lake Geraldine reservoir;
- Use of up to three (3) submersible pumps in the Niaquanguk (Apex) River for water withdrawal;
- Use of a 100 kilowatt (kW) generator to power the pumps;
- Use of up to 540 litres of diesel per day for the generator;

- a type where the potential adverse effects are highly predictable and can be prevented/managed appropriately with known technology.

Parties are also invited to recommend any specific mitigation measures they feel would be appropriate, and to bring any other matter of importance related to this project proposal to the NIRB's attention.
