Hi Richard:

Thank you for providing this.

As you are probably aware, the City identified hydrocarbon contamination of water at the Water Treatment Plant (WTP) in early October 2021. The contamination has since been eliminated, and the *Do Not Consume Order* has been lifted by the Chief Public Health Officer for Nunavut.

As part of the investigation, recommendations were made to update the WTP O&M manual based on new systems and measures implemented at the plant to mitigate any future risk of contamination to the potable water system. Unfortunately, these recommendations were received after the current WTP O&M was submitted to the Board for review. The updates that will be made to address the recommendations from the investigation are expected to be completed by the end of February 2022.

Considering this, the City is seeking confirmation from the Board if the current O&M review can be placed on hold/cancelled, until the new revision is issued to the Board for review. The City will ensure the comments received from the current review are addressed the latest update.

Please confirm at your earliest convenience if the Board accepts this approach.
