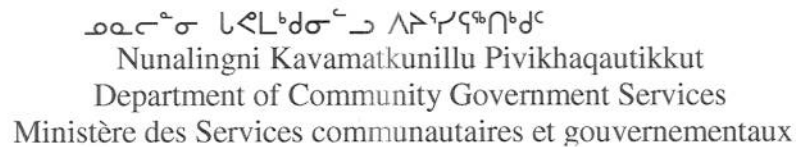
The Resolute Bay Utilidor System is being operated under the Water License No.3 BM-RUT 1012 which will expire on October 31, 2012. This facility was built in the 1970's and has already exceeded its life expectancy. exp Services Inc., an engineering consulting firm, has been retained to develop a long term program for replacing the existing system. This program has three phases: (1) Rehabilitation of Char Lake Pump House; (2) Rehabilitation of Signal Hill Water Treatment Plant including improvements to the Water Treatment Process and (3) Construction and Warranty.

Maintenance works are being conducted on a day-to-day basis in order to keep the system running. Currently Nunavut Construction Ltd is optimizing the Intake Pump Station and the Water Treatment Plant including the treatment process.

The Utilidor system belongs to Community and Government Services (CGS) of the Government of Nunavut (GN) whereas Hamlet holds the Water License for Waste Management and ED&T holds the Water License for the Airport Sewage Lagoon.

CGS will be upgrading the entire Utilidor System and managing the full operating and maintenance program until an agreement is reached with the Hamlet to take over the entire operating responsibilities.

CGS in collaboration with the Hamlet and the Utilidor maintenance contractor is planning to establish an effluent quality monitoring program to satisfy the water License requirements from this summer onward.



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
