

## A. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On April 18, 2013 the Nunavut Water Board provided notification to Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada (AANDC) that Steven Siciliano, on behalf of the University of Saskatchewan had submitted an application for a Type B water licence, No. 3BC-AET----. The submitted information is as follows:

- 1. Water Licence Application form, dated March 9, 2013.
- 2. Exploration/Remote Camp Supplementary Questionnaire, dated April 26, 2013.
- 3. Fuel Spill Contingency Plan, dated 2012.
- Non-Technical Project Proposal Description, dated 2012.
- 5. MSDS datasheet gasoline all grades, dated September 25, 2007.
- 6. Map and Aerial Photographs of worksite.

The licence application is requested for a period of one year with the applicant being on site between July and August of this year. The water will be retrieved from the old RCMP camp at Alexandra Fiord and will be used exclusively for camp purposes while the team of researchers carries out their soil monitoring work.

Interested parties were requested to review the information and provide comments by May 18, 2013.

#### **B. RESULTS OF REVIEW**

On behalf of AANDC, the following comments/ recommendations are submitted to the Nunavut Water Board for consideration:

# 1. Water Licence Application Form and Exploration/Remote Camp **Supplementary Questionnaire**

### General

 AANDC notes that the dates and years are often incorrect throughout all of the submitted documents, frequently indicating a previous schedule from 2012. AANDC recommends that the proponent clarify to the NWB when they will be on site.

## Nature of Interest in the Land

 AANDC notes that the land use Authorization from the Qikiqtani Inuit Association (QIA) has expired. AANDC recommends that the NWB not issue this licence until proof of current land Authorization from the QIA for 2013 is received.

#### Nunavut Planning Commission (NPC) Determination

 AANDC recommends that the proponent submit to the NWB written confirmation of a Land Use Conformity Determination before a licence is issued.

## Proposed Term of Licence

 AANDC notes that the proposed term of licence indicates that the year is 2012. AANDC recommends that the proponent change the year of the term of license to indicate the proper dates being applied for.

### Checklist

AANDC notes that there is no indication whether the \$30 Application Fee or the \$30 Water Usage Fee has been paid to the Receiver General for Canada. If the applicant is exempt from these fees AANDC recommends it be indicated in the space provided.

## **Drinking Water Treatment**

 AANDC recommends that the proponent treat all drinking water before consumption.

## 2. Fuel Spill Contingency Plan

- AANDC recommends the inclusion of the following emergency contact numbers:

  - 2. NT-NU 24 hr Spill Report Line: (867) 920-8130
- AANDC also recommends that all fuel be stored in secondary containment in order to prevent spillage and that drip pans be used during refueling.
