3BC-ASP1111 - Cancellation Application - Arctic Shorebird Project -Re: Canadian Wildlife Service.

Background

The Arctic Shorebird Project was located on Prince of Wales Island 230 km Southwest of Resolute. The camp associated with the project was able to accommodate up to 6 people for approximately 3 weeks. The project involved conducting site visits to Cornwallis and Bathhurst Islands, where no overnighting or camp set-up took place. The camp site, on Prince of Wales Island, consisted of 6 structures. These included tents for sleeping (4), kitchen tent (1) and storage fence. There was also a fuel cache on site.

Original site location could not be used because twin otter landing was not possible. New site location coordinates are as follows: 72°59'20.9"N. 98°58'32.4W.

All structures associated with this site have been removed.

Recommendations/Comments

The Department of Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada, Water Resources Division finds the cancellation application complete and recommends that the above referenced license not be cancelled/ closed until a Water Resource Officer completes a final inspection of the site and provides confirmation that no compliance issues are outstanding with the project.
