Met the camp map of Wagner along with several of the other 10 camp maps. The physical location of this site is one big "backhoe" with rock everywhere - this is my opinion of "concrete" to those who made it through the season. A screen was placed in a medium sized hole into which is placed each wheel & insert water. The area is not conducive to easy drainage but given time the grey water will be "soaked" into the soil. The camp does not have an incinerator (broke hauled to Resolute) due to the low number of staff & also probably a financial restriction. There were a number of civilian guests while I was there, I believe a wolf was also observed. The camp won't return if this site would be used next year, it's a question of finances at Queen's University (most likely). Finally, this camp won't leave much of a footprint when it's dismantled.
