TITLE: Cumberland Peninsula Integrated Geoscience (CPIG) project

OBJECTIVES OF RESEARCH:

Cumberland Peninsula, Nunavut, forms the northeastern extent of the Canadian landmass, a frontier region for resource exploration and development. The northwest corner of the peninsula is occupied by Auyuittuq National Park, a spectacular remote eco-/recreational landuse. The main part of the peninsula supports the Inuit communities of Pangnirtung (pop. 1325) and Qikiqtarjuaq (pop. 500) and between them exposes a 58,000 km² terrain with rocks of unknown age and affinity. Given the current out-dated, reconnaissance understanding of the bedrock geology - based on early 1970's, 1:500,000 scale mapping, and an absence of regional aeromagnetic, geochronological and glacial data, this region presents a significant gap in knowledge which detracts from investment
