We held this licence only for field work conducted on southern Baffin Island in July 2012. The licence is now expired and should be cancelled.

8. ABANDONMENT MEASURES

The following measures have been taken to address the final abandonment conditions required by the licence: (explain, with drawings, how abandonment conditions of the licence have been met; how stream channels have been rehabilitated; how tailings have been recontoured; how instream structures have been removed; and how waste materials have been disposed of. All reclamation work for sites erected was completed during the licence period. Water was taken directly from the Soper River using a jug or handheld water pump, with no impact to the landscape, therefore, no reclamation work was necessary for the water extraction sites. For the sump sites, shallow holes (10-20 cm), were dug into the soil for the disposal of wastewater. At the end of their use, each sump site was filled in with the original displaced soil leaving no impressions in the tundra. For the pit latrines, each pit was dug to 1 meter deep and 20 cm across. These were incrementally filled with some of the displaced dirt during each use, and each was filled in completely at the end of each use filled completely with displaced soil. All markers were removed from pit sites, leaving the location in its original state. All sump sites and latrine pits were far from water bodies.
