Description of the Type & Amount of Contaminants Stored on Site

- o 20 litres of gasoline, stored in plastic jerrycan
- o 60 litres of propane stored in small metal tanks

<u>Description of Spill Prevention Measures During the Handling, Storage & Disposal of</u> Petroleum Products and Hazardous Materials

All products will be shipped and stored in appropriate containers for the type of product. Gasoline will be carefully poured by hand into generator, placed at a distance from any water source.

Propane will be dispensed directly into Coleman cooking stoves All unused hazardous products will be returned to the community of Kimmirut and dispensed for individual use.

Steps Taken to Report, Contain, Clean Up and Dispose of a Spill

The amount of hazardous materials to be used is below the reportable quantities.

All spills will occur at our camp on land, and at a distance from water sources. All spills will be cleaned up as expeditiously as possible, using hand tools and absorbent materials. These will be stored in plastic containers, and removed for disposal in community facilities.
