RE: Hall Peninsula Integrated Geoscience Project - Application for a new Water License

The Canada-Nunavut Geoscience Office, in collaboration with partners from Federal and Territorial governments, universities and industry, is planning on conducting an integrated geoscience project on Hall Peninsula, Nunavut. The study area is located east of Iqaluit and comprises all or parts of six 1:250 000 scale NTS map sheets. Geologic mapping and research will be conducted out of field camps during the summers of 2012 and 2013. Each camp will consist of up to 20-25 people and have fuel stored on site for use with helicopters, heating and cooking.

With this letter, application and corresponding documents, we would like to apply for a Water License and seek NWB permission to proceed with our planned research during the summers of 2012 and 2013.
