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Good afternoon David.

The Nunavut Water Board acknowledges receipt, on December 29, 2011 of your application for a new water licence for the Hall Peninsula Integrated Geoscience Project. In order to complete your application our office requires the following:

1. Exploration remote camp questionnaire (copy attached)
2. All project related information is incorporated with Appendix A. It would be preferable to have a stand alone Project Description and Spill Contingency Plan. The spill plan should be in the format set out by the Consolidation of Spill Contingency Planning and Reporting Regulations R-068-93 addressing the following issues:
  - Inclusion of a table of contents and introduction;
  - Identification of the person in charge, including their name, title and contact information;
  - Identification of a 24 hour contact person, including their name, title and 24 hour phone number;
  - Inventory of hazardous materials stored on site, including MSDS sheets;
  - Explanation of spill procedures in the event of a spill;
  - Discussion on how the spill plan is activated;
  - Identification of the plan's effective period; and
  - Inclusion of AANDC, GN-DOE, DFO, QIAs updated contact information in the emergency contact list.
3. A discrepancy seems to exist between the Maps 1, 2 and 3 with regard to the camp locations.

Once this information has been provided our office will commence the 30 day review and comment period.
