Dear Phyllis,

There are no camps associated with this project.

There is no use of fresh water.

We are testing existing wastewater that runs through licensed lagoons and wetlands (created by the hamlets). There will be no removal or moving of wastewater out of licensed treatment systems in hamlets except for small amounts needed for laboratory analyses (in the order of several litres). Disposal of these samples will be into the wastewater system in Rankin Inlet (testing wastewater samples and disposing down the toilet).

Monitoring will occur from June 2008 to freeze up (approx Oct 2008) and again in the summer of 2009 and summer of 2010. Monitoring will be in different phases (baseline and intensive but could occur during any of the summer weeks).
