## Recommendations/Comments

After reviewing the Spill Contingency Plan for the Mars Project, INAC is satisfied that the plan meets most of Part H –Conditions Applying to the Spill Contingency Plan of the Water License 3BC-MAR1014.

INAC however has a couple of recommendations/comments.

INAC recommends that the proponent submit a topographic map which better represents the area topography and a detailed description of the facility including size and storage capacity of existing buildings.


INAC recommends that the proponent use some sort of berm structure as secondary containment for the fuels on-site rather then absorbent pads. The absorbent pads would not be sufficient if a drum ruptured.

INAC also recommends that the proponent use secondary containment measures at the temporary fuel holding area near the airstrip.

The Mars Society are required to provide the Nunavut Water Board all outstanding information referred to above in order to comply with the requirements of the Spill Contingency Plan for Water License 3BC-MAR1014.
