The crew will bring a film or digital camera weighing between 50lbs and 75 lbs. as well as other camera equipment needed to film the birds. A small hand held recorder may be used to record the sound of the birds. The crew will only bring the equipment that is absolutely necessary.

The lands will not be damaged in any way. The crew may need to use pegs or rocks to make sure the camera stand does not move during filming. Any minor disturbance of the land that may happen will be fixed by the crew.
