Hi Joeli,

I think Richard summarized the needs in his previous email of July 24, 2008, however I will see if I can help you to understand what is currently taking place, what may take place and how the Hamlet may deal with the situation appropriately.

In reviewing the history of email and the current water licence information on file with the NWB, it is understood that the Hamlet is obtaining water for distribution to the community from Marcil Lake (water lake). There is a water distribution (access point) fill station at the lake and this is what the Hamlet utilizes for filling the water trucks. Previous application information refers to the water supply as a "Lake", therefor my understanding is that the lake is NOT a reservoir that would be owned and operated by the Hamlet, and is accessible by anyone, and to be used by anyone in the area. If it is a natural water body, then the Hamlet would not have control over who may use the resource (you may control the access if the only access is the road to the fill station). The Hamlet would have control over the use of the access point or fill station and therefor, use of the water pumped from the lake with the fill station, and that water would be part of the Hamlet's water use, according to the Licence issued by the NWB.

If the water is to be pumped from the Lake for the hotel use (from a location other than the fill station under the Hamlet's licence), then a water licence will be required. This licence may authorize the amount of water and use, the water source and the method of taking the water from the Lake. It would not provide any direction on the human consumption aspect of it and whether it meets the requirements of other legislation (ie Public health). This would be the responsibility of the hotel owner (or water licence holder) to verify and meet any requirements of the health inspector for the use of the water. This may involve similar procedures and requirements as the Hamlet is required on its water supply, providing sample test results on a regular basis for bacteria and records showing Chloriation levels are being met. There may be other requirements, these are the two that come to mind.

If you have concerns with respect to your community's water supply, whether it is regarding water quality or quantity, other users and their affect, I would recommend you contact your regional water resources officer to find out what your options may be.

The four or five buildings you mentioned over the phone are they residential units, hotels, office buildings?

If the water use were for his own domestic use for his own personal home he would not require permission. If he is providing water to his buildings for consumption by others than he would need permission from the Hamlet if the lake is the Hamlet's water supply. If the water is from another lake and is not for his personal use for his home than he would need a water licence.
