Absorbent pads were used to soak up the fuel on the ground while a 45 gallon drum was used to collect leaking fuel until the hole was repaired. The hole was repaired and the file was closed.
		2008282 – in the spring of 2008, approximately 100 L of an unknown product (possibly oil, glycol or a mix; product is a thick yellow-green liquid) was identified floating on a small pool of water beside the solid waste facility; a barrel was partially sunk in the pool. The liquids and contaminated soil around the pool were dug up, put into empty drums and stored in the bulk metal/hazardous waste storage area. The file was closed.
