## Cambridge Bay Old Townsite Clean-up

While conducting the municipal inspection in Cambridge Bay, I talked to Ikey Lvalik, the Secretary Manager for the Hamlet. He mentioned that some work had been done on the reclamation of the old townsite and wondered what was being planned to continue the clean-up.

I went to the location of the old townsite and took some pictures (9 attached). As can be seen by the pictures there still remains some scrap steel and other debris near the shore across from Cambridge Bay. Further back from the shore were the foundations of some buildings. The scrap has been piled up.

There are two possiblilities for further clean-up.

- Using a loader and/or cat and/or truck to haul the scrap away to a disposal site. The lumber could be burned in a pit and the pit backfilled. The scrap metal could be discarded in an appropriate place, compressed by having a cat walk over it, and backfilled. Barrels and other items that may contain hydrocarbons should be checked to ensure that they are empty.
- 2. Another choice is to ocean dump the scrap metal by loading a barge and towing it to an appropriate site for dumping.
