Comments: Effluent is released into a series of terraced ponds which flow around the municipal waste management area and down gradient to Cambridge Bay. Samples from the outfall to the bay were green in color and had obvious odour of sewage. Work to address the structures and create holding cells to increase treatment time and quality are planned for this season. Currently a health risk exists to the community as during sampling Char were noted feeding in the outfall stream adjacent to the community.

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Comments: Municipal Waste Management Area requires fencing. Installation of the fence was ordered in a Direction in 2008. This work is scheduled to take place this year. The Municipal burn and bury requires work be undertaken to ensure combusted materials are properly covered over. Water management within and flow off the facility is also of concern. Water was found to be pooling adjacent to the Municipal Waste Management Area and entering the effluent stream flowing off site. Samples were collected.
