Corp bought out Fred in process was required to due diligence on fuel tank farms and associated areas. Kitmuna proposes to build landfarm and remediate 1200-1500 cu. m soil. Liner available. Material available to undertake landfarm construction ASAP. Wilf to attend council meeting tonight and was seeking clarification on process and issues related to the undertaking. Kitmuna has engaged Environmental Engineer, Wayne Bryant who did the original Environmental Site Assessment. I clarified that NWB would require baseline/background data and Environmental site assessment, engineering details for the landfarm, operation/maintenance and long-term monitoring/future land use proposal. I explained the licensing administrative process and that in all likelihood project would not require NIRB screening and therefore NWB would need to post for minimum 30 days. Wilf seemed frustrated with the bureaucracy. I indicated that NWB requirements are to in line with the intent of the land claim to ensure that the public is informed and sites are cleaned up to ensure water resources are protected and impacts mitigated.

I indicated that two options were available

- 1) Cam Bay needs to file amendment to water license and insure that there liability is covered through separate contact between the parties. Recommended that Wayne could provide a sample of a "construction/operation/maintenance" contract typical of what is used in the south between municipalities and operators if they are not one in the same.
- 2) Kitnuna apply for its own individual water license.

Indicated to Wilf that should he require further clarification to contact me.
