



The Department of Community and Government Services continues to manage the 3-Cell sewage lagoon system in Cape Dorset, Nunavut. This correspondence is the update on this project as per the Inspector's Directions.

Dillon Consulting has been retained and they identified P – Lake as the new site for the community sewage lagoon. Due to the location of the lake, an access road will need to be constructed.

The final design and tender documents are out to tender. Nunavut Water Board approval was requested during the design process. Environmental studies are near completion. The contract will be awarded upon NWB approval.
