RE: Cape Dorset Sewage Lagoon Emergency Decant, Water Licence No. 3BM-CAP1925

Dear Joseph Monteith:

As per Part D, Item 3 of the Hamlet of Cape Dorset Licence No. 3BM-CAP1925, this is notification of plans to discharge waste from the three-tiered (2001) sewage lagoon. An emergency decant of the sewage lagoon is needed to complete repairs to the lagoon berm and immediate approval is requested.

As you are aware, the sewage lagoon in Cape Dorset suffered a berm failure this spring. The decant of the lagoon this week is required to allow access to the site for the inspection and repair of the berm. Details of the berm repair will be provided separately.

Samples will be taken during the decant for comparison to effluent criteria set out in Part D, Item 2 of Water Licence No. 3BM-CAP1925, and reported to Crown-Indigenous Relations and Northern Affairs (CIRNAC).
