Obviously "no" is not the right answer because even if I do say "no", the decant will happen anyway; only uncontrolled. Been this route when I was with the Territorial government and Iqaluit's lagoon blew out (several times).

I do not normally handle this file so in the absence of anyone else here who can make such a decision, the Hamlet should proceed as requested, in order to avoid a greater problem.

Has environment Canada been contacted regarding this potential violation of Section 36 (3) of the Fisheries Act? If not, they should be advised.

Finally, the Hamlet should be prepared to provide a detailed, written report describing why the situation was allowed to go as far as it has; i.e. an emergency request for a decant. I will forward this message onto our Water Resources Officers.
