Hi Paul

I looked this over and the Licence (attached) conditions that would apply in this scenario are under PART E: CONDITIONS APPLYING TO MODIFICATIONS AND CONSTRUCTION.

The proposed activity would be considered a "Modification to a Waste Disposal Facility" under PART E, Item 2, and because we do not have 60-days notice it will require written approval by the NWB. I think the quickest way forward will be for you to submit this as a formal notice of modification to our licencing department (email copied), that includes this Stantec Memo, and additional information, and a short project summary outlining the rational for the activity, the timeline, any environmental protection measure employed, and any other relevant information. Put particular emphasis on the short timeline to highlight the need for a timely review & written approval. Then following completion, we would under PART E, Item 4, require the submission of as-built plans.

Hi Derek,

As discussed, the berm of the bottom tier of the lagoon washed out and we need to complete an emergency repair prior to winter setting in. I have attached the scope of work developed by Stantec to repair and stabilize the lagoon berm.

A brief summary of the scope prepare by Stantec consists of installation of a new culvert to replace the culvert at the location of the washout, import materials and compact around the culvert, adjust the berm slope from an approximate

1.5/1 to a new 2/1 slope. Due to the timeframe for this project, no design drawings are prepared or available for this repair. The idea of building out the berm is to fix the washout on the downslope of the berm and to increase the stability.
Can you please advise the Government of Nunavut (GN) whether the Nunavut Water Board will allow this repair.
