

Re: Coral Harbour Sewage and Solid Waste Disposal Sites Notification of Fence Construction


Dear Mr. Wall,

In August of 2002, Dillon submitted an amendment application for the water license of Coral Harbour, on behalf of the Department of Community Government and Transportation (Iqaluit). At that time, improvements to the sewage disposal and wetland treatment site were planned, which included reconstructing the retaining wall and installing bollards and wheel stops at the drop-off area.

Since these improvements have been conducted, it has been noted by community residents that the caribou have been drinking and eating the contents of the sewage lagoon. It is important to local people, and all the caribou meat that is exported to Europe, that there is no risk to human or animal health. Thus, the Department of Community Government and Transportation has requested that the sewage wetland area be fenced to eliminate these habits of the caribou.

This letter is to inform the Nunavut Water Board of this change to the wetlands sewage treatment area in Coral Harbour. The chain-linked fence to be constructed will be approximately 6 ft high, and surround the entire wetlands treatment area, with a gate installed at the sewage drop-off site. The attached Figure illustrates the location of the fence.
