Hello Brady,

Andrew and Christine forwarded your questions to me to review.

I would like to take this opportunity to let you know that I have taken over the municipal water licence files from Christine, Eva and Andrew and I am now the lead Inspector for all municipalities in Nunavut. I would kindly request that all questions related to the municipal water licence reviews that have to do with inspections be forwarded to me to avoid any delay and to maintain consistency. I would also ask if you wouldn't mind circulating a note to let the other technical officers at the NWB know as well that I am the contact for municipal water licences...

I have just spoken with Megan Lusty at CGS to discuss any changes to monitoring sites and to get a better understanding of the issues with the current water monitoring sites. I also have not been to site yet but Megan has a good understanding of the site layout and explained the issues they have had there.

After talking with her and getting a better understanding of the challenges on site in Coral as well as an understanding of where compliance is being met I can with confidence support CGS's request to go to three monitoring sites. AANDC

also agrees that location COR-3 be moved to directly downstream of the lagoon due to the health and safety issues of sampling within the lagoon. I would also support moving COR-4 to a location midway between COR-3 and COR-5.

After discussing that discharge parameters are primarily met at COR-4, I would suggest that COR-5 be determined this summer during the inspection with Hamlet representatives and AANDC. Once an agreed upon location for COR-5 is determined, it will be reported to the NWB to become part of licence. I would also like to suggest that COR-4 and COR-5 be moved by the licencee where it is reasonable due to changes in the water table which may not allow for a representative sample to be taken and that notice is required to be given to the Inspector and the NWB when a monitoring site is moved. A follow-up inspection by AANDC can be conducted to determine the validity of the move of location.

I think a certain flexibility in the location of the monitoring sites can provide better results overall in the water samples and agreeing to the proposed move of the locations as well as reducing a few sites may promote overall compliance within the monitoring program.
