#### Comments:

### A. Background

On August 5, 2014, the Nunavut Water Board ("**NWB**") provided notification that it had received an Abandonment and Reclamation Plan for the Hamlet of Gjoa Haven's (**the** "**Licensee**") former sewage lagoon from the Government of Nunavut's Department of Community and Government Services (GN-CGS) on the Hamlet's behalf. This plan was submitted pursuant to Part G, Item 1 of the Hamlet of Gjoa Haven's municipal water licence, #3BM-GJO1318.

On September 5, 2014 AANDC provided comments to the NWB concerning the above mentioned abandonment and reclamation plan.

On September 30, 2014 the NWB provided notification that it had received a revised Abandonment and Reclamation Plan for the Hamlet of Gjoa Haven's former sewage lagoon prepared by Dillion Consulting Limited and submitted by the GN-CGS on the Hamlet's behalf.

Interested parties were asked to review this application and provide comments by October 30, 2014.

#### B. Results of review

On behalf of Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada ("**AANDC**"), the following comments and recommendations are provided:

# 1. Scheduled decommissioning of the former sewage lagoon

#### Comment:

It is unknown whether or not effluent discharge and the subsequent removal of sludge will continue past 2015.

#### Recommendation:

The Licensee should provide the NWB with an up-to-date decommissioning schedule when more information is available.

# 2. Sludge Management

## Comment:

The Licensee has proposed a sludge management alternative whereby sludge would be removed from the new sewage lagoon and subsequently placed in the old lagoon where it would be left to "dry".

# **Recommendation:**

The Licensee should provide notification to the NWB if and when this strategy will be implemented.
