

Please accept this letter as our formal application to have the Hall Beach Block Land Transfer expanded to include those lands described in the attached metes and bounds description. You will note that this description does not exclude those lands previously transferred to the Commissioner pursuant to OIC PC 1983-907, as your office can better decide whether an exclusion is required.

As you should be aware, it was agreed to expand the Hall Beach Hamlet boundary as a result of TFN CLINT negotiations, with the understanding that the BLT boundary would be amended to be concurrent.

We have also included an extract from NTS Map Sheet 47A at 1:250,000 scale showing the existing BLT and Hamlet boundaries outlined in red and that portion of the new Hamlet boundary dealt with by this application outlined in Green.

We would appreciate your keeping this office apprised of the progress of this application through the OIC process.

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Schedule Hall Beach Block Land Transfer Expansion

IN THE NORTHWEST TERRITORIES; ON BAFFIN ISLAND;

All that parcel being more particularly described as follows; all topographic features hereinafter referred to being according to map sheet 47/A, Edition 2, of the National Topographic Series, produced at a scale of 1:250,000, all longitudes and latitudes being referred to the 1927 Datum;

Inuit Owned Lands Parcel HB-05 hereinafter referred to is as shown on Descriptive Map Plan 244, numbered 77969 C.L.S.R., 2688 L.T.O., Sheet 4 of 7 registered in the Land Titles Office in the Northwest Territories and the Canada Lands Surveys Records in Ottawa, except where the description shown by the said Descriptive Map Plan is replaced by that shown by a plan of survey in accordance with the Agreement Between the Inuit of the Nunavut Settlement Area and Her Majesty the Queen in right of Canada signed on May 25, 1993, in which case the parcel is as shown on the replacement plan,

Commencing at the northeast corner of Inuit Owned Lands Parcel HB-05, being at longitude $81\emptyset$ 40°, 00"W at the intersection of the ordinary high water mark of Foster Bay at approximate latitude $68\emptyset$ 54° 20"N;

Thence first easterly, then southerly, then southwesterly and then westerly along the sinuosities of the ordinary highwater mark of Foxe Basin and the ordinary highwater mark of Parry Bay to the southeast corner of Inuit Owned Lands Parcel HB-05, being the intersection of the ordinary high water mark of Parry Bay and longitude 810 40' 00"W at approximate latitude 680 31' 10"N;

Thence north along the easterly boundary of said Inuit Owned Lands Parcel HB-05 to the point of commencement.

Containing 54,000 ha more or less.

SAVING AND EXCEPTING thereout and therefrom, the existing Block Transfer, made by Order in Council P.C. 1983-907 of March 24th, 1983.

SAVING, EXCEPTING AND RESERVING thereout and therefrom, all mines and minerals whether solid, liquid or gaseous and the right to work the same.

SAVING, EXCEPTING AND RESERVING thereout and therefrom, the beds of all bodies of water and the water rights connected therewith.
