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iv. a summary of modifications and/or major maintenance work carried out on the Water Supply and Waste Disposal Facilities, including all associated structures and facilities; The design for the expansion of the sewage lagoon cell #1 is complete. The project was tendered, a contractor was selected and the contractor is ready to start construction in summer. No work is planned on sewage lagoon cell #2 at this moment. a list of unauthorized discharges and summary of follow-up action taken; The wastewater is treated by two cells Lagoon system. Both cells function as exfiltration process. Sewage was drained out from cell #1 through the hole of the Southern berm and was absorbed in the wetland prior to reaching into the sea. a summary of any abandonment and restoration work completed during the year and vi. an outline of any work anticipated for the next year; No abandonment and restoration work was done during the reporting period. No plan is to abandon the existing waste site until the new facility is built and commissioned. a summary of any studies requested by the Board that relate to waste disposal, water vii. use or reclamation, and a brief description of any future studies planned; The design for the expansion of sewage lagoon cell #1 was supported by NWB and the Hamlet water licence was amended in order to support construction of the lagoon. viii. any other details on water use or waste disposal requested by the Board by November 1st of the year being reported; and Unauthorized discharge from Sewage lagoon cell -1 is the concern of INAC and Hamlet was asked to fix this problem as soon as possible. ix. updates or revisions to the approved Operation and Maintenance Plans. Hamlet has been using the O&M manuals for effectively operating their water supply system, sewage lagoon and waste management facility. A new manual will be developed once the construction of the expansion of Sewage Lagoon cell #1 is complete and commissioned.
