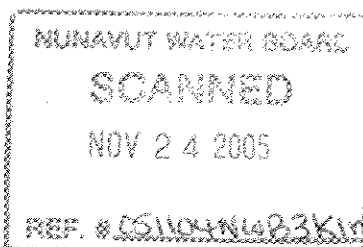
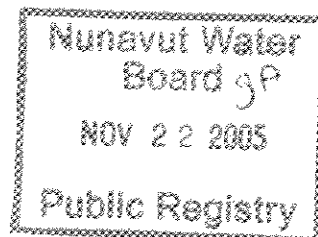

Your letter dated October 31 2005 refers to the development of a Monitoring Plan. This has not been done as we never heard from the NWB in accordance with your letter of August 21 2004. Taking the sewage samples is still a problem.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION THAT THE HAMLET DEEMS USEFUL:

No work was done on the road leading to the new sewage and solid waste disposal sites in 2004 by Community and Government Services.

FOLLOW-UP REGARDING INSPECTION/COMPLIANCE CONCERNS:

I believe we are in total compliance so far as the operation of our solid waste site and sewage disposal site is concerned at the present time.

Obtaining and testing of sewage samples remains a problem but we are prepared to discuss this issue with you to see if it can be resolved.

- iv. No major work was required on the water supply system during 2004. Minor repairs were carried out on the power unit in the truck fill station and the required signage was erected at the water lake near the truck fill station.

At our Waste Disposal Facilities we completed the following work:

- (a) All debris of any description along the road leading to the water lake was removed and taken to the dump site.
- (b) All full or partially full 45 gallon drums in the dump site or along the road leading to the water lake had all missing bungs replaced and were moved to a level site within the dump site.
- (c) All batteries in the dump site were removed to our Parking Garage lot to await shipment south for proper disposal.
- (d) The sewage disposal site was moved approximately 30 meters south closer to the edge of the mountain as required and a granular material berm was constructed to direct the flow.
- (e) The bagged sewage area was filled and covered over with a depth of approximately 2 feet of granular Material.
- (f) The general solid waste site was bulldozed and covered over with granular material. This did not include one large area of scrap metal, consisting of mostly scrap vehicles or equipment.
- (g) The main burning site was leveled with the bulldozer and covered with 8 to 12 inches of granular material.
- (h) To my knowledge we did not accept any hazardous waste from commercial sources in 2004.
