RE: MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL USING THERMAL OXIDATION

The Water Resources Division, Indian and Northern Affairs Canada is acting as project manager for a feasibility study into the use of the thermal oxidation method of waste incineration in municipalities in the Northwest Territories. The project is being conducted in cooperation with Environment Canada, Municipal and Community Affairs, Health and Social Services, and Renewable Resources.

The study will include a comparison of cost of operation of thermal oxidation system and municipal landfills such as that used by your community. The contract for the study is expected to be awarded on or about February 14, 1996. When it is awarded you should expect to be hear from the successful firm. They will be looking for information about the operation of your dumpsite. The study group would appreciate any information that you can provide.
