**<u>Subject</u>**: Proposed works or undertakings will likely avoid negative effects to fish habitat.

If the above plans have changed at all, the advice in this letter may no longer apply and you should consult with us to determine if further review is needed.

It is our opinion that a harmful alteration, disruption or destruction (HADD) of fish habitat is not likely to occur if you implement your plans as proposed. A subsection 35(2) Fisheries Act authorization is not necessary. However, failure to properly implement the measures outlined in your plans may result in contravention of subsection 35(1) of the Fisheries Act, which states: "no person shall carry on any work or undertaking that results in the harmful alteration, disruption or destruction of fish habitat."

This letter of advice does not allow the deposit of deleterious substance into waters frequented by fish nor does it release you from the responsibility to obtain any federal (for example, the Navigable Waters Protection Act), provincial or municipal approvals that may be needed.
