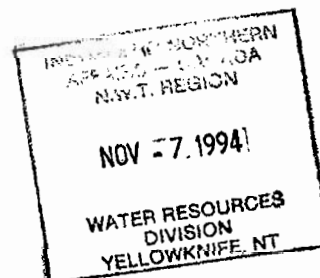
Re: Water Analysis Results; June 30, 1994 Inspection

1. Attached, for your information, are the results from the analysis of the water samples collected during my June 30, 1994 inspection.
2. The results indicate that the drinking water meets the Canadian Health and Welfare Drinking Water Guidelines for the parameters tested for with the exception of the pH level. The pH for water taken from the Tulugak River (SNP station 0640-01) was 5.63. The Health and Welfare Guidelines recommend that drinking water have a pH in the range of 6.5-8.5. We again encourage you to promote the use of lime to raise the pH of the drinking water.
3. Please also find attached a bilingual (Inuktitut / English) information package that will explain the various parameters that were tested for.
4. Also enclosed for your information is a copy of the Canadian Health and Welfare Guidelines.
