RE: NPC File # 149231 [Renewal and Amendment application of the Hamlet of Sanikiluaq Water Licence # 3BM-SAN 1520 Type B for 5 (five) years term]

The following works and activities have been proposed in the above-noted project proposal:

- 1. Renewal of a <u>Type B Water License # 3BM-SAN 1520</u> which is coming to expiration. Although the proposal notes the intention to establish new waste disposal sites in the future, specific details including the proposed locations are not yet known and the current review has not considered the establishment of new waste disposal sites.
- 2. Related NIRB File No.: EX223.
- 3. Location: Qikiqtani Region [Sanikiluaq].

The Nunavut Planning Commission (NPC) has completed its review of the above noted project proposal. NPC has determined that this project proposal is outside the area of an applicable regional land use plan. The activities associated with this proposal were previously reviewed by NPC, and a conformity determination was issued on October 27, 2014 which still applies. This project proposal is exempt from the *Nunavut Planning and Project Assessment Act* (NUPPAA) under section 235 of that Act. The project proposal is exempt from screening by the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB). The project proposal does not require screening because it belongs to a class of works or activities set out in Schedule 12-1 of the Nunavut Agreement, and the NPC does not have concerns regarding the cumulative impacts of the project proposal.
