Subject: Whale Cove Application

Hi Adrian,

In response to your request for an application form for the facilities in Whale Cove, I have the following information:

First of all, Whale Cove is an unlicensed community. Therefore, it is not possible for NWB to licence a certain facilities, such as the sewage treatment plant or waste disposal facilities, without first or at least at the same time licensing the community. With this in mind, I am providing the information for the overall municipality's water licence.

The application form and the municipality's supplementary questionnaire are available through the internet on our ftp site at <ftp.nwb.yk.com> in a folder called "NWB General Information." Note that the municipality's supplementary questionnaire are in both English and Inuktitut (the title ending in "S" is in syllabics/Inuktitut and "E" is in English). If you have problems obtaining the information, let me know.

To have a complete application, NWB needs the following (most items can be sent by e-mail to my address at rbecker@polarnet.ca) :

- application form (on ftp site)
- supplementary questionnaire (on ftp site)
- short easy-to-understand summary of the application in both English and Inuktitut
- \$30 application fee payable to the Receiver General for Canada
- all relevant maps, drawings, photos (preferably pages no larger than 11" by 17")

Please note that some communities have difficulty completing some of the technical information for the supplementary questionnaire. For this reason, help can be requested from CG&T and the Kivalliq Health and Social Services if needed.

If you are not going to be involved in the licensing process for the municipality as a whole, can you please pass this information on to the SAO? Looking forward to hearing back from you.
