Unfortunately, I have not got a more detailed response to your letter quite yet. As you are aware, the Resolute Bay Sewage Lagoons previous license was/is held with the department of Economic Development and Transportation as a result of the physical location. With it being on Airport property the department has been involved at the signing level of the license. Fact of the matter is that the EDT has had very little other involvement aside from being just another customer in the community which requires sewage disposal. In receiving your notice of the requirement to re-license the facility, EDT has been in contact with the Dept of CGS in an effort to have them provide the legwork as it relates to manuals, day to day ops and the funding for design and expansion of the facility simply because its in their realm of activities and not something that EDT should be held responsible for. I guess you could say that the problem is Symantec's, and I would tend to agree, however at this point, it remains the roadblock in providing you a clear response to your letter.

As of today, EDT/CGS have not yet been able to come to an agreement on how to respond to INAC's letter of non-compliance dated December 14, 2015. This water licence is a unique circumstance in that EDT holds the licence for the lagoon which is part of the communities waste system, yet the actual need for/management of and any associated details of liabilities and responsibilities still need to be worked out with CGS.

EDT/CGS have a meeting setup for early next week to discuss these details and provide some stability on an appropriate path forward. This meeting will allow a more informed response to the non-compliance letter.

CGS/EDT are working together to bring the lagoon under a licence and into compliance, and it is expected that our meeting will help to develop a plan of action to be conveyed to you shortly thereafter.

If you have a manner of extending the date of response by a week in light of this, please take the appropriate steps to allow for some additional time. If this is a case where you will be moving to next steps, im sure that this information will allow you the insight to what action is underway in an effort to satisfy your requests prior to moving to the enforcement process.
