**Re: Revised Draft Scope and Draft EIS Guidelines for Qulliq Energy Corporation's "Iqaluit Hydroelectric" project proposal**

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Dear Parties:

Qulliq Energy Corporation's (QEC; the Proponent) "Iqaluit Hydroelectric" project proposal (the Project) is currently undergoing a Review by the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB or Board) pursuant to Part 5 of Article 12 of the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement (NLCA).

Section 12.5.2 of the NLCA states:

*"...The NIRB shall, upon soliciting any advice it considers appropriate, issue guidelines to the proponent for the preparation of an impact statement. It is the responsibility of the proponent to prepare an impact statement in accordance with any guidelines established by NIRB."*

On August 9, 2013, the NIRB received correspondence from the Proponent indicating its intention to pursue a coordinated approach for the NIRB's Review and the Nunavut Water Board's (NWB) consideration of the Type A Water Licence application for the Iqaluit Hydroelectric Project (NWB File No. 4AH-IHP----).

The NIRB and the NWB will work together to develop a detailed description of the proposed file-specific coordination between the Boards for the Iqaluit Hydroelectric Project and will distribute this to all parties once complete. In the meantime, a public guide to this coordinated approach entitled "Detailed Coordinated Process Framework for NIRB Part 5 Reviews and NWB Licensing" was previously developed by the NIRB and NWB and is available from the NIRB's online registry here:

#### REVISED *DRAFT* SCOPE FOR THE ASSESSMENT

The NIRB has initiated a comprehensive public process to delineate the scope of the Project and the factors to be assessed through the Board's Review, as well as to assist in the NIRB's

development of guidelines for the Proponent's preparation of an environmental impact statement pursuant to the NLCA, Section 12.5.2. On July 15, 2013 the NIRB issued an initial *Draft Scope* for its Review of the Project and requested that parties provide comments for the NIRB's consideration, based upon their mandate, jurisdiction and areas of expertise or interest.

Following a review of all comments received by the Board, the NIRB has prepared the enclosed the Revised *Draft Scope* for the Project. While some comments received for the initial *Draft Scope* have not been directly incorporated into the enclosed Revised *Draft Scope*, the NIRB has taken this feedback into consideration during its preparation of the enclosed *Draft Guidelines* for the Preparation of an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS Guidelines) for QEC's Iqaluit Hydroelectric project.

#### EIS GUIDELINES DEVELOPMENT

Section 12.5.2 of the NLCA directs the NIRB to issue Guidelines to the Proponent for its preparation of an EIS. An EIS is a detailed document prepared by the Proponent in accordance with the EIS Guidelines issued by the NIRB which identifies, predicts, evaluates and communicates information about the ecosystemic and socio-economic impacts of a project proposal. An EIS also provides for the identification and development of mitigation measures – those provisions or measures which are designed to control, reduce or eliminate potentially adverse impacts of an activity or project.

The NIRB will draw on information obtained during the scoping of this Project in the development of the EIS Guidelines and also offers opportunity for public comment into their development. At the completion of this iterative process, the NIRB will issue the EIS Guidelines to the Proponent for its preparation of an EIS for the Project.

The Board invites interested parties to review both the enclosed Revised *Draft* Scope and the *Draft* EIS Guidelines for the Project and provide comments to the NIRB based upon their mandate, jurisdiction and areas of expertise or interest.

All parties are asked to ensure that their comment submissions:

- Identify the issue(s) of concern;
- Include a clear rationale of the issue's importance to the environmental assessment for the Project;
- Identify any specific information requirements or direction which should be incorporated into the documents to address each issue of concern; and
- Reference the page, section, paragraph and/or item numbers of the respective documents to which comments are applicable.

The following provides an overview of the next steps in the NIRB's Review of the Iqaluit Hydroelectric Project:



<b>September 10-12, 2013</b>	NIRB Scoping Meetings (Iqaluit, Kimmirut, Pangnirtung)
<b>September 16, 2013</b>	Parties submit comments to the Revised <i>Draft</i> Scope and <i>Draft</i> EIS Guidelines
<b>September 24, 2013</b>	Final Scope issued and Revised <i>Draft</i> EIS Guidelines released for 10 day comment period
<b>October 4, 2013</b>	Parties submit comments to the Revised <i>Draft</i> EIS Guidelines
<b>October 15-18, 2013</b>	<i>Tentative</i> EIS Guidelines Workshop

Again, the Board invites Parties to submit comments on the Revised *Draft* Scope and *Draft* EIS Guidelines for the Iqaluit Hydroelectric Project on or before **Monday, September 16, 2013**.
