

<b>4. DESCRIPTION OF UNDERTAKING</b> (attach plans and drawings) Canadian Arctic Holidays (CAH) has owned and operated Arctic Watch Lodge, a tourism facility located in Cunningham Inlet on Somerset Island since 2000. The lodge is on federally leased land.  During July and August, Arctic Watch guides take 50 to 100 tourists, by sea kayak, foot and by ATV and Special Truck, primarily for wildlife viewing for beluga whales, muskox and polar bears. Groups from Arctic Watch travel a maximum of thirty kilometres from Arctic Watch.  Guests and staff stay at the lodge. Water is drawn from the Cunningham River. Consumption is <u>30,800</u> gallons during a period of 40 days. <u>(140m³)</u> All visitors to Arctic Watch arrive by charter from Yellowknife.


