Hi Don,

Arctic watch was inspected last year and was told that they must apply for a license.

Found were;

- Open burning -- Barrels.
- Open dumping of human waste into a ditch/hole dug 200 m from camp
- No secondary containment
- Intake of water from adjacent river
- Camp located within 30 M setback from water
- Discharge of grey water to adjacent river (downstream of in-take)
- Hazardous waste on site - No segregation
- Vehicle on site was noted to perform regular stream crossings
- Air strip on site - on alluvial plane across river from camp
- Fuel stored on runway.
- Old equipment on site (historic)

I had hoped that the owners would have been in contact with the board by this late date.
