Comments: Propane tanks should be fixed in place against buildings so they cannot fall over. The one fuel barrel I found on site is not in a secondary containment. A small berm should be placed under the fuel barrel to avoid any potential for spills as the site is unattended for most of the year.

#### **Non-Compliance of Act or Licence:**

Annual report for 2011 should be filed with the NWB as per the licence conditions, even if no activity occurred on site. Backhaul of empty tanks is recommended. Fuel on site is to be placed in secondary containment in case of leaks. As there is only one barrel on-site and there is currently no evidence of leaking, this work can be delayed until it is practical, preferably before winter.
