Dear Ms. Filiatrault,

I am writing the Nunavut Water Board to enquire if I would need to submit a water licence application for the outfitting company that I am in the process of getting started. I am aiming at August 2010 to be a big game outfitter as well as sport fishing and sightsceing tours.

I plan on basing my camp at Byron Bay which is approximately 95 miles west of Cambridge Bay on Victoria Island, it will be situated next to a river that the Kitikmeot Foods utilises as a fall fishery for Arctic Char.

For the camp I plan on having three 10' X 12' canvas tent frames as living quarters and a 14' X 16' cabin as the kitchen. I will also be operating all terrain vehicles for the big game hunting in the area so there will be no more than 8 drums of gasoline for the ATV's and the boats used for hauling supplies from Cambridge Bay. I plan on using propane heaters for all the living and eating quarters and so the plan is to have the appropriate number of 20lb propane tanks as well as 2 - 100lb propane tanks for the kitchen. For drinking and cooking water I will be using a 50 gallon tank for fresh water storage and use, for bathroom facilities my plan is to dig holes in the ground and have a moveable outhouse. All grey water (dish and personal hygiene washing water) will be dumped away from the campsite most preferably in a shallow ditch.

This camp will be a seasonal one running from mid August to late September annually and possible use in the winter when travel by snowmobile is deemed safe. If there is anything that I am missing please do not hesitate to call me so that I may be able to address any shortcomings.
