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Good morning Goump,

I just left you a message to follow up on this email information request to clarify a few things and find out if NPC had any further information to provide. I wanted to clarify that this request is for information only and that no formal application is currently being prepared. The contractor was asking the question so we are following up. As we understand, NWB regulates freshwater so as long as there are no freshwater waterbodies impacted or waste discharged, they do not have any regulatory authority over seawater use. As per the emails below, NWB and CIRNAC has suggested that we follow up with NPC to identify any other Nunavut regulatory requirements. To be clear, the question has been raised as an alternative to the approved freshwater source used for dust mitigation/construction purposes given the observation of low flow conditions in the freshwater source.

Can you please confirm NPC's position on this alternative water source and what Nunavut regulatory requirements would be, if any?
