Re: Notice of Part 4 Screening for Environment Canada's "Eureka Weather Station Facility" project proposal

Dear Carol Carroll:

On April 5, 2012 the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB or Board) received Environment Canada's (EC) "Eureka Weather Station Facility" project proposal. On April 19, 2012 the NIRB received a positive conformity determination (North Baffin Regional Land Use Plan) from the Nunavut Planning Commission. Further, on April 19, 2012 the NIRB received a referral from Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada to screen the project. The NIRB has assigned this project proposal file number 12XN020.

The proposed project proposal is to continue operation of the existing Eureka Weather Station and its associated facilities. The Eureka Weather Station is located within the Qikiqtani Region on Crown Land Reserve #1021 which was originally established in 1983 and has been in operation since 1947. The facility is located approximately 407 kilometres (km) northwest of Grise Fiord. The primary purpose of the facilities is to collect meteorological information. The secondary purpose is to provide logistical support and a staging location for science based research, exploration and military operations as well as serve the small tourist trade that visits the area. Currently, the Eureka station is used by both the Department of National Defence and the Natural Research Canada (NRCan) Polar Continental Shelf program. Operations will continue year round at the various facilities that are now in place.

The proposed project includes:

- Operations and maintenance of all of the existing Eureka infrastructure, specifically:
 - o Airstrip and all access roads,
 - o Tankfarm and fuel supply system,
 - o water and sewage lagoons,

- o heating and electricity,
- o biotreatment cell (landfarm),
- o disposal/burning of non-hazardous landfill,
- o hazardous materials collected and barged off site to be disposed of appropriately,
- o Accommodations, laboratories, and general storage and warehousing.
- Ongoing use of the Eureka as a base camp and logistical support/staging areas for other entities/organisations such as the Department of National Defence and the NRCan's Polar Continental Shelf Program (PCSP).

The NIRB is copying parties and municipalities potentially affected by Environment Canada's project proposal with this letter, and we invite interested parties to comment directly to the NIRB by May 24, 2012.

The NIRB would like parties to provide comments regarding:

- Whether the project proposal is likely to arouse significant public concern; and if so, why;
- Whether the project proposal is likely to cause significant adverse eco-systemic and socio-economic effects; and if so, why;
- Whether the project is of a type where the potential adverse effects are highly predictable and mitigable with known technology, (please provide any recommended mitigation measures); and
- Any matter of importance to the Party related to the project proposal.
