## Re: <u>3BC-EUR0611 – Eureka Weather Station Spill Plan – Environment Canada</u>

Indian and Northern Affairs Canada (INAC) reviewed the Revised Spill Contingency Plan for the Eureka Weather Station, submitted to the Nunavut Water Board (NWB) on March 5, 2008. In conducting our review, INAC referred to the documents on the NWB's FTP-site under **3BC-EUR**.

 The proponent must provide in the Spill Contingency Plan an onsite contact number (i.e. SAT number) in the event of a spill.





- The plan should include a contact number for the Canadian Coast Guard in the event of a spill on water during fuel transfer.
- On Page 9 of the spill plan the contact number for Department of Indian Affairs and Northern Development is correct, but the location should be Iqaluit, Nunavut rather than Yellowknife.
