Good Afternoon Mr. Wyman

Following our phone conversation I will summarize the main issue to be resolved before proceeding with this Application

The issue can be summarized as follow:

"DND is asking for an increase in the daily limit of 10 m/day to potentially up to 299m/day, but not increasing the annual aggregate limit, assuming that DND draws from the water source up to 299m/day for 12 consecutive days (so within the new daily limit and within the annual volume of 3650 m³/yr) would that not have the potential for a change to the significance of the potential effects on the water source than the current withdrawal of only 10 m/day".

If the capacity of the water source, is such that even 12 consecutive days of withdrawing the full changed daily limit of 299 there would be no significant change to the impacts associated with this water use, it may be possible for the NWB to consider this application to be not so much an "amendment" to the Licence as an administrative revision (minor modification) to make things consistent with the other licences by expressing the allowable volume as both an annual limit and a daily limit (which would be under the Type B threshold).

In that case the NWB could consider that neither the amended NLCA or NuPPAA apply to this change.
