Good Afternoon Ian

I have an additional question that needs to be answered in order to decide if the application requires further evaluation.

Is the proposal aimed to have ONLY an annual limit rather than both an annual and daily limit?

The Nunavut Waters Regulations set the thresholds for various types of licences on the basis of daily limits, therefore the nwb would still have to insert a condition in order to ensure the Type B daily threshold of 300 cubic meters per day for water use is not exceeded. The Board can't eliminate this daily limit in the Water licence, this is in order to ensure the licensee does not exceeds the maximum threshold for a type B.

If the Applicant's intention is to eliminate the daily limit from the licence, that is a significant change to the Project and that may involve other licensing requirements, like a new application for a new Type A licence rather than a Type B Licence.

Afternoon Sonia,

I understood that licenses were issued with either a daily or an annual limit...but now I know better. All of DND licenses are Type B with an annual limit, except the one at CAM-M which has a daily limit. For consistency, we simply wanted to convert the CAM-M daily limit ( $10\text{m}^3/\text{day}$ ) to the equivalent annual limit ( $365 \times 10 = 3650 \text{m}^3/\text{yr}$ ). Additionally, DND could run exercises and operations at CAM-M, where a temporary surge in personnel would consume more than  $10\text{m}^3/\text{day}$  but not more than  $3650 \text{m}^3/\text{yr}$ . During the last exercise, the surge consumed less than  $30 \text{m}^3/\text{day}$  (only 10% of the Type B daily threshold). So to answer your question, a Type B license with a daily limit of  $300 \text{m}^3/\text{day}$  and an annual limit of  $3650 \text{m}^3/\text{yr}$  is requested for CAM-M.
