The annual operation and maintenance (O&M) activities at Cape Dyer during the reporting period included the quarterly preventive maintenance, fuel tank cleaning and inspection, routine infrastructure assessment, and fuel resupply.

Water Use and Waste Disposal

The average daily water use at Cape Dyer during this reporting period was well below the stipulated maximum volume as indicated in the NWB water licence. The waste management was consistent with the Nasittuq Environmental Protection Plan, meeting the terms and conditions stipulated in the NWB water licence.
