



**Subject: Licence Holder Name Change Application – Summary (English)**

As per Reference B, Nasittuq Corporation is hereby submitting an application for a name change of the licence holder of the subject licence from **<North Warning System Office>** to **<Nasittuq Corporation>**

Nasittuq Corporation is an agent for the joint venture between ATCO FRONTEC Corp. and Pan Arctic Inuit Logistics Corp. and has been contracted by the Department of National Defence to operate and maintain the North Warning System since 1988.

The North Warning System (NWS)/Department of National Defence consists of long range and short range radar sites, extending from Yukon across the Arctic and down the Labrador coast, that are operationally connected to the Regional Operations Control Centre (ROCC) in North Bay by a Long-Haul Communications Network (LHCN). Control and support infrastructure for NWS is provided through various locations as described in the following paragraphs.

The radar station at Dewar Lakes, designated as FOX-3, Nunavut is subjected to the Nunavut Water Board licensing requirement. The radar station is unmanned all year round. There are four scheduled maintenance trips to this station every year. Each of these trips comprises a 4-person crew for a duration of 4 days. Major maintenance projects resulting in a higher occupancy rate at the stations may occur once every 2-3 years. Unplanned corrective maintenance day trips to the station during the year may be required from time to time. FOX-3 is managed by Nasittuq's Logistics Support Site in Hall Beach, Nunavut.
