The following works and activities have been proposed in the above-noted project proposal:

1. Amendment to NWB licence 3BC-SHE0919 for continued operation and maintenance of this North Warning System site.
2. Associated NIRB FILE No: 03DN117
3. Summary of modification: Testing and release of berm water and construction of landfarm for remediation of hydrocarbon impacted soils on site.
4. Location: Kitikmeot [CAM-3, about 50km south of Taloyoak]

The Nunavut Planning Commission (NPC) has determined that this project proposal is outside the area of an applicable regional land use plans. The Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB) previously screened the works and activities associated with the current proposal under file NIRB 03DN117 (Oct. 14, 2003), including activities associated with yearly operation of the facility.

The NPC has determined that the above-noted project proposal is significant modified to the original project because of the inclusion of a hydrocarbon landfarm.

The above-noted project proposals require screening by the NIRB under section 12.4.3 of the Nunavut Agreement as amended because of the addition of a component or activity that was not part of the original proposals and their inclusion is a significant modification of the project.
