Further to our telephone conversation of July 21, 2006, following is a concise summary of the Relicensing Project as amended in our letter of July 18, 2006.

The main features of the project include:

- 1450 m by 45 m gravel runway at Sand Lake;
- A temporary Weatherhaven construction camp at Sand Lake (40 persons);
- The operation of a winter trail between Ulu and Sand Lake to haul equipment north from Ulu to High Lake and Sand Lake;
- A 500,000 litre fuel storage facility at Sand Lake;
- 12 km of road from High Lake to Sand Lake, approximately 6 m wide and 0.3 m high constructed of sand and gravel taken from two quarry sites;
- Long-term Weatherhaven camp (70 persons) with generator, incinerator, 50-100,000 litres of fuel storage and shop; and
- All equipment and supplies not coming from Ulu will be flown to Sand Lake or High Lake by Hercules, landing on the ice at Sand Lake and High Lake.
