Dear Ms. Beaulieu,

As per Part B, Item 3, of the above reference water licence, we wish to inform the Board of a potential area overlap between the proposed NNF project and components of the remediation project being undertaken for the Nanisivik Mine Site under Licence 1AR-NAN0914.

The only area of overlap, which could impact the execution of the NNF project, is in the area of the proposed naval distillate storage tanks and the access road to Arctic Bay. Ongoing remediation activities are in the direct footprint of the proposed facility. We respectfully submit the attached NNF Project Overlap Plan, which provides details on the various areas of development planned for the NNF project site and defines the area of potential overlap.

All other components of the Nanisivik mine site remediation project will not be affected by the NNF project.

Please note the location of the camp infrastructure for the NNF project is located within the existing cargo marshaling area at the site and not on the concrete slab south of the helicopter landing area as indicated in the issues section of the water licence document. The camp was located in the cargo marshaling area because the Nanisivik mine site remediation project is currently using the concrete slab for temporary storage of contaminated soil.
